A Word from your Pastor

Proposition 8 would amend the California Constitution to provide that only marriage between a man and a woman is valid or recognized in California.

For two thousand years, Orthodox Christian theology has been clear on the nature of marriage. Far more than a social contract, marriage is a sacrament and an expression of the profound unity that exists between a man and a woman in love. Through marriage, each couple can transcend their own humanity and unite not only “with each other” but also “in Christ.” Our Lord, Himself, stated:

"Have you not read that he who made them from the beginning made them male and female, and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man put asunder." (Matthew 19:4-6)

In the Orthodox wedding ceremony, we offer the prayer that God “establish them in that sacred oneness that rests in You. For in the beginning You made them man and woman, and it is by You that woman is joined to man, to support one another and to perpetuate humankind.”

In another place the marriage prayers of the Church proclaim, “In Your infinite grace and great goodness You came to Cana-in-Galilee and blessed the marriage there, to show that lawful marriage and the bearing of children is Your will.”

All people are to be treated with respect and love, since we have all been created in the image and likeness of God. However, marriage is a solemn commitment between a man and woman who are given the privilege of creating a new family and sharing in the creative love and power of God, both physical and spiritual.

For these reasons, all Orthodox Christians should support the fundamental principle expressed in Proposition 8.

FROM OUR NEW GREEK SCHOOL TEACHER...

THE POWER OF BEING UNITED

Whenever a vision is able to surpass all obstacles and become reality, it is a true success. The three Greek Orthodox parishes of the greater Sacramento area have performed a small “miracle.” They have joined forces for the spreading of Greek culture, while overlooking every difficulty and transforming weaknesses into much promising specialties.

With the help and support of the Greek Ministry of Education and the Consulate General’s Education Office in San Francisco, a new unified Greek language program has been running for one month now at all three parishes: at St. Anna’s in Roseville under the direction of Ms. Bessie Kondos, in Elk Grove under the direction of Mr. Demos Papadopoulos, and in Sacramento under the direction and overall coordination of the Program by Mrs. Becky Yerocostas.

This “miracle” has been supported by the parishioners, and at this moment at least sixty (!) students, minors as well as adults, are participating in Greek language lessons with warmth, enthusiasm and the desire to connect with contemporary Greece. The levels which I have been asked to teach are varied. The need from student to student is diverse and for me, as an educator, it is an unprecedented and very attractive challenge. On one hand, my goal is to transfer my knowledge and my experience, and on the other hand, to help as much as my role allows in the spreading of the Greek culture.

I would like from this post to thank all of you – parishioners, Directors, Priests, and of course the Greek Ministry of Education for this unique opportunity that has been offered to me and to promise that I will do my best to show that I am worthy of the responsibility that I have undertaken. Because when one believes in miracles, then it is very likely to experience them.

Religious Education

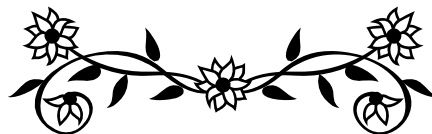
Our Sunday School program is off to a great start—it is not too late to join us! Please bring your children to Sunday School promptly at 10 AM.

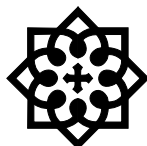
The Golden Rule of “doing unto others as you would have done unto you” has long been recognized as a basic principle of our Christian faith. But did you know that God appears to have actually created mankind with the built-in ability to be charitable and generous, so that we could fulfill his desire that we serve others?

Medical researchers at Duke University made this discovery while studying participants playing a computer game. In some of the games, the participants played for charity, and in others, they played for personal gain. The researchers found that when the participants played for charity, a particular region of the brain lit up as a “hot spot” on a special x-ray called a functional MRI.

The area that lit up on the MRI is the part of the brain responsible for perceiving the intentions and actions of others. According to the researchers, this means that a person’s ability to see events or actions of others as meaningful and consistent with one’s own values is critical for generosity and charitable behavior.

God appears to have created this special part of the brain so that we have the ability to think of more than just ourselves, and to ensure that we are able to experience the virtue of charity and “do unto others” through philanthropy. Using this part of the brain may explain the tremendous generosity shown by our parishioners to our church. Our parishioners give generously of their time, talents, and treasure because they recognize that St. Katherine provides a meaningful and fulfilling environment that sustains the Orthodox faith and values that we all hold dear.

We hope that the work of St. Katherine Church creates a warm glow in your heart as well as your brain. During the holiday season and throughout the coming year, we hope that you will continue to fulfill God’s desire that we do unto others and support our parish through your contributions to stewardship, our mortgage reduction program, and through your outstanding efforts at the crab feed, festival and other special events. Your fellow parishioners appreciate your altruism and generosity, and we look forward to your continued support as our church grows and thrives.

Today we received a gift which we did not ask for; let us bestow alms to those who cry out to us and beg!

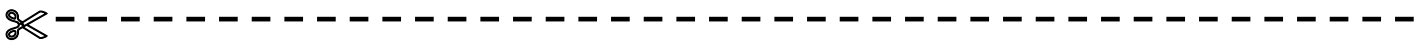
The present day has opened the door of heaven to our prayers; let us also open our door to those who ask of us forgiveness!
