A Word from your Pastor

Did you know that the cross you might wear around your neck or hang in your home is filled with tremendous power?

We celebrate the feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross every year on September 14th...a feast dedicated to a sign that is more than just decoration. The Cross of Christ holds miraculous power...it is a precious symbol of protection, inspiration and victory.

The simple “plus sign” that we know as the cross symbolizes, of course, the Cross that was used to put Jesus Christ to death. Over the centuries it has been depicted both as a simple design and as an elaborate and beautiful variation on the shape of the instrument of death that it was known to be in the time of Jesus.

We hang it around our neck, display it in our home, decorate churches and other structures with it and use it as the principle symbol of the Christian faith.

Why?

Because it has tremendous power. Besides being a vehicle of Christ’s death, the cross was also the gateway to His resurrection. In other words, the cross became the means by which Christ showed us that He was the Life and the Resurrection of all mankind. Jesus brought divine power to the Cross and we receive His same invisible grace through it. All that we need is two things: (1) first, to believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who came to save us from sin and give us eternal life. And (2) second, to act like we believe it by showing love, kindness and goodness to all those around us – to our family, our friends, and even to our enemies.

The symbol of the cross reinforces our faith in Christ. It reminds us that the One Who was able to defeat the power of death, can also save us, no matter what we may face.

These hard-working folks enjoy teaching the children and young adults of Saint Katherine.
